My Two Cents

What happened to summer? It seemed as if just last week we were getting ready for Field Day, and the last few weeks have caused many of us to break out our long-sleeved shirts and sweaters. As I write this, the official start of the fall season occurs during the end of the week, and it doesn't take much imagination to see the cold, gray days of winter sneaking up on us.

I guess that calls for a reality-check on my part—for a variety of reasons, there's no way I'm going to get the conduit for my coax runs dug and my HF vertical moved this year. Still, I swore to myself I'd have a good HF antenna up

for the winter, so I'm currently planning on hanging my G5RV in the two black walnut trees on the west side of the house. That just leaves me the problem of how best to run the coax from one end of the house to the other, where my room/shack is located.

One option would be to attach them behind the eavestroughing, but I'm not certain how to snug it up close to the trough so it doesn't look shabby.

The second option would be to snake it under the rear porch decking, then along the house, but since rabbits and other critters like to live there, I'm concerned that they'll gnaw through the

coax.

I'll also have to get my entry box set up. I picked up a Keptel cable entry box off eBay that will hold half-a-dozen Alpha-Delta surge suppressors (I'm planning for the future) but I need to procure a metal panel on which to mount them before installing them inside the box. I'd prefer copper, but may have to run with steel to serve as the backplane.

Since I'm new to this, and want to do a good job that won't need to be replaced next spring, I'm not only open to suggestions, but actively seeking guidance. If you've any suggestions, please drop me a line.

VHF Propagation for the Computer-Disadvantaged

Most of you know I use (and love) SPLAT!, a program for showing VHF path losses and coverage. There are a couple of SPLAT! images on the club website.

Trouble is, SPLAT! has been a Linux thing, and it is kind of hard to use. There is now a Windows release, but it doesn't deal with the hard to use part. Not only is it a command line program, but it really takes a command line mindset. Very cool if you happen to be "that way", but not so cool for the non-computer geeks.

Turns out a couple of schools in

Oklahoma decided that it didn't have to be that way, and built web interfaces to SPLAT!

If you go to <http://splat.ecok.edu/> you can select one of three servers. You then "register" your station, providing basically call, lat/long and antenna height. You can then get a coverage map drawn. If there are other stations of interest already in the database, you can easily get path calculations between them. Of course, no reason you couldn't add additional stations.

A somewhat simpler approach is a point to point web interface at

<http://www.heywhatsthat.com/profiler-0904.html>. This merely shows the path. It doesn't actually do the SPLAT! calculations so it doesn't show you signal strengths, but it does give you a quick and easy look at the stuff between you and another station. Instead of entering lat/long, you simply click on a Google map—hopefully you know where you are on a map!

Fall Technician Class Announced

As mentioned elsewhere in this issue, and as noted in the flyer on the proceeding page, the Midland Amateur Radio Club will be offering a Technician Level licensing class this fall. All the information needed to pass the Tech test will be covered in this course, along with hands-on demos and real-life examples provided by the instructors. The required textbook, The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual Second Edition, which normally costs \$25, will be available at a discount

of \$20.00 through the club. An exam will be scheduled after the conclusion of the course. The course will be held at The Salvation Army Building, 330 Waldo Rd.
